

A typical landscape. Plants are replaced 3-4 times a year. It is:

- Expensive for labor and plants
- High maintenance if kept looking good
- Harmful to the soil



Using long-lived native plants instead of annuals in full bloom is less expensive and better for the planet.


Most garden center plants are:


- At the ends of their life cycles
- High maintenance
- Often treated with poisons that kill pollinators

Good for the store, but not for consumers or the environment.



Doug Tallamy's research shows that even small native landscapes provide habitat.





As an entomologist, he says, "Plants need to do more than to just be pretty. They should play a role in your yard's ecosystem."

There are so many beautiful, earth-friendly alternatives to lawns and seasonal plantings.





Using long-lived, native plants and avoiding landscape-wide poisons is sustainable and saves money.

No pesticides! So THIS happens...

A bit of patience is needed

This beautyberry shrub will be beautiful in the landscape because small, dormant plants have a much better chance of success.



Planting natives is a long-term investment—not an instant landscape.

Buy from native nurseries

Sometimes growers offer plants at their peak, but other times look for fact sheets or educational signs for plant details.





Underneath trees is a perfect place to reduce lawn and add natives.

This reduces maintenance and increases habitat.



MAGNOLIA GROVE

Reduce the use of power tools.

Install native shrubs in hedgerows where they are allowed to take their own shapes.



The variety of shrubs:

- Makes them more resilient against disease
- Provides more interest and better habitat



Convert lawn areas to Freedom Lawns.


